Jason DeMars graduated from Faribault High School and served in the United States Marine Corps for 5 years learning Aviation Support Equipment Mechanics and Gas Turbine Engine Mechanics before transferring to the Marine Corps' first-ever Bar Coding System Department, where he coded and inventoried the fleet's aviation equipment.

When he returned home, he used the Montgomery GI Bill to attend SCC's Machine Tool Technology program - the same program his father Dennis graduated from in 1968 (the program's first graduating class) and the same school where his mother Kathy taught for many years. He graduated in 1994 and went to work in industry at Owatonna Tool Company, whose tuition reimbursement program, along with his GI Bill, enabled him to attend classes at Normandale Community College for General Studies.

Jason didn't know it at the time, but he would continue to attend college part-time for many years, even after leaving OTC to teach at South Central College in the Machining department. As education requirements changed for technical program faculty, Jason continued his education at Minnesota State University, Mankato, earning a Bachelor's degree in Technical Teacher Education in 2005 and a Master's degree in Manufacturing Engineering Technology in 2011.

Jason is currently Fabrication Manager at Cybex International in Owatonna and serves on the Computer Integrated Machining Advisory Committee at South Central College.
