

EFFECTS OF OVER EXPOSURE

- Swallowing: Brain, kidney, liver damage, may be fatal.
- Inhalation: Narcosis, nausea and vomiting.
- Eye Contact: May cause minor eye irritation.
- Skin: No effect.

FIRST AID

First Aid Procedures

- Eyes: Irrigation of the eye immediately for five minutes is good safety practice.
Consult medical.
- Skin: Wash off in flowing water. Decontaminate clothing and accessories before reuse. Good personal hygiene..
- Inhalation: Remove to fresh air if effects occur. Consult medical.
- Ingestion: Toxic by ingestion. Induce vomiting immediately. Call a physician and/or transport to emergency facility.

NOTE TO PHYSICIAN

Stain for evidence of corneal abrasion or injury. May cause neurologic signs and symptoms. May cause kidney damage. May cause electrolyte imbalance. Suggest baseline CBC, UA, and 12 test. Suggest baseline electrolytes. Consult standard literature. Use of alcohol may be helpful.
