Description

The Pre-Social Work Transfer Pathway AS offers students a powerful option: the opportunity to complete an Associate of Science degree with course credits that directly transfer to designated Social Work bachelor's degree programs at Minnesota State universities. The curriculum has been specifically designed so that students completing this pathway degree and transferring to one of the seven Minnesota State universities enter the university with junior-year status. All courses in the Transfer Pathway associate degree will directly transfer and apply to the designated bachelor's degree programs in a related field. Universities within the Minnesota State system include Bemidji State University; Metropolitan State University; Minnesota State University; St. Cloud State University; and Winona State University.

Program Student Learning Outcomes

- 1 Identify behavioral interventions and strategies appropriate to person centered thinking philosophy in the least restrictive manner
- 2 Assist students to develop personal and cultural awareness while working within a diverse society
- Recognize the intersectionality of poverty with other social issues that prevent individuals from achieving their goals
- 4 Demonstrate professionalism in the social services field in regard to ethics, communication, teamwork, and therapeutic relationships with individuals in need
