Description

Students will be taught to collect data related to client physical and mental functioning, administer prescribed medications, demonstrate effective therapeutic communication, provide thorough reporting and recording, prioritize and care for multiple clients with a variety of disorders, perform technical nursing skills and understand the importance of maintaining confidentiality. After completion of the 40 credits of the Diploma Nursing Program, students are qualified to receive the Practical Nursing Diploma and are eligible to take the NCLEX-PN examination.

External Requirements

Minnesota State Administrative Rules

6301.2340 REQUIRED CRITERIA FOR NURSING EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Maintain minimum standard on the licensure examination of greater than 75 percent for candidates from the program who, during any January 1 through December 31 period, wrote the licensing examination for the first time.

Entry Requirements

Students must be:

- Admitted fully to South Central College.
- 2. Provide evidence of current Nursing Assistant Registry in the State of Minnesota (NA, R). SCC offers a Nursing Assistant course (HCTC 1886), which helps prepare students for the NA test-out.
- 3. Demonstrate a college "Nursing" General Education GPA of 2.5 or higher.
- 4. Demonstrate good academic standing at the college.
- 5. Provide proof of attendance from a SCC Nursing Information session offered on Faribault and North Mankato Campuses.

- 6. Admission Date: Application to the Nursing Program is a separate process from admission to the college. The Nursing application window is open twice a year during the fall and spring semesters.

Annual requirements for clinical practice:

- 1. Student Health Record A short medical history and immunization status.
- 2. Two-Step Mantoux, negative chest x-ray, or a QuantiFERON TB Gold (TB blood titer).
- 3. Hepatitis B Series or immunity.
- 4. Tdap-last tetanus within last 10 years.
- 5. Varicella vaccination or immunity.
- 6. Influenza Vaccine by November 1st every fall semester.
- 7. Covid-19 Vaccination.
- 8. Proof of current health insurance Background Study completed and cleared.
- 9. Proof of current CPR certification: Current "Professional" Training in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) for <u>all ages</u> (*newborn through adult*); including 2-rescuer scenarios, foreign-body airway obstruction and the use of an automated external defibrillator.
