Basic Rider Course

Day 1 8am-2pm | Day 2 8am-1:30pm | \$245

- Sat/Sun, April 30-May 1
- Sat/Sun, May 7-8
- Sat/Sun, June 25-26
- Wed/Thurs, June 29-30
- Sat/Sun, July 23-24
- Sat/Sun, Aug 6-7
- Sat/Sun, Sept 24-25

NOTE: Riders who have already failed a state and/or MMSC skills test twice are NOT eligible and must skill test at a DVS exam station.

Intermediate Rider Course

2-7pm | \$55

- Sunday, June 26
- Sunday, September 11

Required Protective Riding Gear

- DOT approved helmet
- Long sleeve shirt or jacket
- Boots that cover the ankles
- Long pants with no tears or holes
- Full-fingered gloves (cycle/gardening/winter)
- Rain gear or cold weather gear is recommended depending on the weather.
- Eye protection (glasses/sun glasses/face shield)
- Sufficient beverages for the weather and snacks

Basic Rider Course

Learn how to ride, and earn your motorcycle license endorsement! Supportive and friendly MSF-certified rider coaches will teach you how to operate a motorcycle and the basic skills you need to safely ride on the street.

The Basic Rider Course includes:

E-Course - A highly interactive 5-hour online training program provides riders with the basics of motorcycling before range training.

Range Training - 11.5 hours of hands-on riding exercises on the range that will guide riders through the basic skills of straight-line riding, stopping, shifting and turning, and gradually progressing to swerving and emergency braking.

Skills Test - A final on-bike skills test that must be successfully passed in order to earn a motorcycle endorsement.

Motorcycles - Training motorcycles are provided for riders of all sizes.

Course Requirements

Permit Info: motorcyclesafety.org

Adults (18+)

- Present a valid motorcycle permit to your instructor. Expired permits are accepted if they have been expired for less than 1 year.

Minors (16-17)

- Valid vehicle driver's license REQUIRED.
- Participants under 18 must have a [waiver form](#) signed by a parent or guardian in PERSON at the training location, or it must be NOTARIZED.
- If you pass the course, you will receive course completion cards to take the motorcycle permit and skills test at an exam station.

Intermediate Rider Course

The Intermediate Rider Course provides an annual skills refresher for newer motorcyclists, returning riders, and experienced motorcyclists who are comfortable on their own motorcycle or scooter.

Participants must be proficient in basic riding skills and will build on their existing skills with guidance from an MSF-certified rider coach.

Riding Skills Practiced:

- Cornering
- Counter steering
- Maximum braking
- Riding strategy
- Risk management
- Swerving
- Tight turns
- Traction management
- U-turns

Groups or clubs may register their entire group for the Intermediate Rider Course for only \$300. Email cwe@southcentral.edu to inquire.

Course Requirements

- Participants ride their own motorcycle during the course.
- Motorcycles must be street legal, licensed, insured and pass a basic inspection.
- Show proof of insurance to the instructor.
- Have a valid driver's license with either a motorcycle endorsement or a valid permit.
- Be proficient in the basic skills of clutch control, straight-line riding, turning, shifting and stopping.
- Participants under 18 must have a [waiver form](#) NOTARIZED or signed by a parent or guardian in PERSON at the training location.
