Course Information

Description

This course covers machinery set up and reconditioning. The student identifies setup and reconditioning procedure, follows the set-up and operators manual, uses a checksheet, uses a torque chart, learns the procedure for threading and taping, install shell-coils and keenserts, sharpens drill bits, installs the hydraulic system, follows the hydraulic diagram, assembles machinery, touches up paint and adjusts the equipment for field use. (Prerequisites: None).

4. Assemble farm equipment.

Learning Objectives
Explain proper tire mounting and wheel bearing adjustment Identify hydraulic fittings
Install hydraulic cylinders and plumbing
Bleed and charge hydraulic systems
Install machine accessories and extensions

Install warning lights and wiring

5. Add attachments to farm equipment

Learning Objectives
Install wiring for road operation
Install machine options according to manufacturer instructions

6. Proper use of safety equipment and machines

Learning Objectives
Safety glasses used at all times
Proper lifting techniques with forklift and appliances
Stabilization stands used on all suspended components
Safety procedures followed from manufactures
