Course Outcome Summary

Course Information

Description	This drawing course will further the students' understanding of the core elements of drawing: line, composition, perspective, proportion, texture, value, and shading. These drawing elements will be taught through both traditional and modern methods. The course will also include several short lectures to give examples of the work, and to expand art appreciation. There will be a strong emphasis on the student's ability to critique their own work along with their peers. The dialogue within the classroom will help to expand the student's skills and process. Construct a comprehensible balance

4. Demonstrate an understanding of perspective

Learning Objectives

Demonstrate perspective using line
Demonstrate perspective using shading and texture

5. Give examples of texture within a work of art

Learning Objectives

Identify texture within the surroundings
Use texture as shading
Use texture in an unorthodox manner

6. Apply value to the work of art

Learning Objectives

Determine where values should exist in the work
Use values properly to establish shading

7. Implement shading to develop a three dimensional quality

Learning Objectives

Demonstrate shading using gesture drawing
Demonstrate shading using blending methods
Demonstrate shading using texture

8. Interpret proportion in several ways

Learning Objectives

Establish proportion as a tool for perspective
Manipulate proportion to make a statement within the work
Understand proportion within the two dimensional realm

9. Create an atmosphere

Learning Objectives

Form an arrangement that is aesthetically pleasing to the viewer
Form an arrangement that is unpleasant to the viewer
Employ a focal point or lead the eye

10. Identify the positive and negative space in a composition

Learning Objectives

Use positive space in a non-traditional manner
Use negative space in a non-traditional manner
Manipulate the existing space to create a different composition

11. Articulate the significance of a creation in verbal form

Learning Objectives

Explain the personal process of creation
Discuss the subject matter in relation to its audience

12. Create a visual journal of experience by collecting sketches, clippings, colors and ideas

Learning Objectives

Use the visual journal to generate ideas
Identify inspirational material
Develop a personal connection with the work created

13. Demonstrate learned skills within the guidelines of a variety of assignments

Learning Objectives

Demonstrate understanding of various media
Demonstrate a recognition and understanding of class expectations
Demonstrate a clear developmental process within each assignment
Demonstrate creativity in interpretation of the assignment
Demonstrate intent correctly
Create a work of art with all of the drawing elements

14. Create preliminary drawings of a composition

Learning Objectives

Use gesture drawing technique
Use contour drawing technique

15. Illustrate an understanding of where the subject matter comes from

Learning Objectives

Analyze the origin of the work
Identify specific inspirations

16. Create relevant content in drawings

Learning Objectives

Identify themes, metaphors, and content
Communicate intent with meaning

17. Identify similarities between one's work, and the work of peers and masters

Learning Objectives

Explain the similarities and differences between one's work and peers' work
Identify relationships to other artists' works

18. Extensive participation in class discussion and critiques

Learning Objectives

Determine the effectiveness of the work of art
Actively participate in the discussion
Identify strengths within a work of art, and provide constructive criticism for the betterment of peers
Identify drawing elements that exist within a work of art
