Course Information

Description This course will continue the residential building project started in Residential

Principles I. Students will do layout for roof trusses, ceiling joists, or rafters. The roof will be installed on the residential project to match the existing structure according to building points. All types of roof construction and roof framing will be analyzed, discussed, and implemented where applicable. Roof plywood, roof edge, ice and water guard, along with tar paper, will be installed. Students will shingle and flash the roof according to manufacturer's recommendations and local building codes. Window installation on the project will also be completed in the course.

Identify 1/2" orient strand board.
Describe the advantage of 5/8" plywood.
Discuss 1/2" plywood.
Install roof plywood.

6. Construct roof overhangs.

Learning Objectives
Calculate eve overhangs.
Identify gable and overhangs.
Build boxed returns.

7. Explore roof underlayment.

Learning Objectives
Install ice and water guard.
Describe 15# and 30# felt.
Install appropriate paper on roof.

8. Describe roof covering.

Learning Objectives
Explain asphalt shingles.
Identify wood shingles.
Describe metal roofing.
Follow manufacturer recommendations.

9. Apply roof ventilation.

Learning Objectives
Install soffit vent.
Apply roof vents.
Fasten ridge vent to roof.
Shingle over ridge vent.

10. Install residential windows.

Learning Objectives
Identify casement windows.
Describe double hung windows.
Explain fixed glass windows.
Follow manufacturer's recommendations for installation.

11. Install residential doors.

Learning Objectives
Explain single entry doors.
Identify patio doors.
Execute installation by manufacturer's directions.

12. Demonstrate job site safety.

Learning Objectives
Wear safety glasses.
Utilize hard hats.
Implement fall protection requirements.

13. Install insulation in ceiling and walls.

Learning ObjectivesInstall R-21 insulation in exterior walls.
Install R-44 insulation in ceiling.

14. Apply vapor barrier and sealant.

Learning Objectives

Apply 6 mill vapor barrier to ceiling and exterior walls.

Install acoustical sealant around window, door, and bottom plate.

15. Install drywall to ceilings and walls.

Learning Objectives
Install 5/8" drywall to ceilings.
Install 1/2" drywall to walls.
Demonstrate knowledge of appropriate screws and spacing for 5/8" and 1/2" drywall.
