Manage environment and work practices.  
Acknowledge overhead power lines.

**5. Demonstrate excavation safety.**

**Learning Objectives**

Acknowledge soil and water table.  
Monitor to prevent cave ins.

**6. Demonstrate scaffold safety.****Learning Objectives**

Inspect scaffold by "Competent Person".  
Maintain railings, toe boards, scaffold grade planking.
