#### **Course Information**

**Description** This course will examine challenges unique to managing multiple sites. It provides practical information and tools to help managers close the communication gaps created by distance, and get peak performance from employees they don't see everyday. (Prerequisites: 17 credits in early childhood education/child development or instructor approval)
