Course Information

Description

This is an introduction to the role and function of the Community Paramedic (CP). The student will learn about the Community Paramedic's specific role and function as a member of the health care team and part of the community. The student will identify the components of the role, define it, and explain the "scope of practice" for the position of CP. Additionally, the student will learn about the role of the CP as an advocate for clients in the community. Prequisites: Acceptance into the Community Paramedic Program. All CP courses must be taken concurrently.

2. Explain the definition of health from a community perspective.

Define health, health promotion, disease prevention and wellness in public health.

Describe how literacy levels can impact health.

3. Establish community links between health needs and social service systems.

Learning Objectives

Assist individuals and groups in identifying and pursuing community goals.

Develop leadership skills in community members to improve health access.

4. Outline methods on how to use health care and social service systems.

Learning Objectives

Explain how to build and maintain social networks.

Complete a service assessment and write an outreach plan.

5. Articulate needs and perspectives of the community to health and social service systems.

Learning Objectives

Synthesize solutions to health disparities as it relates to health services.

Identify when and how prevention is a part of health care.

6. Identify social determinants of health.

Learning Objectives

List social, behavioral, cultural, community, and environmental determinants of health.

Describe from a community perspective how social, behavioral, cultural, community and environmental determinants impact health.

7. Develop a plan to address social determinants of health in the community.

Learning Objectives

Identify components of a healthy community.

Assess and assist in prioritizing general health care needs and assets of the community.
