## MUSC 141 Vocal Ensemble - Concert Choir

### Course Outcome Summary

#### Course Information

<b>Description</b>	Vocal Ensemble is a performing ensemble. Students will meet for rehearsals three times a week and learn a repertoire of both traditional and modern songs while practicing appropriate vocal techniques. After learning their music for several weeks in the semester, the vocal ensemble will perform at selected elderly and assisted care facilities in the area. (Prerequisite: None) (This course must be taken in conjunction with MUSC131 to fulfill the requirement for MNTC 6: Humanities and Fine Arts)

Recognize and sing or play a repertoire of selected examples of folk and art songs.  
Discuss the cultural context of selected examples from American and world folk and art song traditions.

**2. Engage in the creative process by singing.**

**Learning Objectives**

Discuss and demonstrate basic vocal skills: breath support, pronunciation of vowels, and head tone.  
Sing songs in a group during class, both by notation and by rote.

**3. Perform a concert for elderly residences.**

**Learning Objectives**

Discuss music to be performed for senior residences.  
Discuss social matters related to performing for elderly residents of active-living and assisted living facilities.  
Perform for elderly residents.
