NURS 1220 Pharmacology for Practical Nurses

Course Information

Description This course will address basic concepts of pharmacology and the effects on the

body. The course focuses on drug classifications as they apply to all body systems. Understanding the therapeutic and adverse drug effects and appropriate actions will be addressed. The student will describe federal regulations to guide practice. The role of the practical nurse for client medication administration will be discussed using credible resources. (Prerequisite: Acceptance into Nursing Program is required in

order to register for Nursing Courses)

3. Choose appropriate actions when responding to potential and actual incompatibilities of client medications.

Define differences between desired and undesired effects for medications (ex. side-effect, adverse effects).

Discuss use of drug classifications to recognize risk for potential incompatibilities.

Identify signs and symptoms of adverse events and actions to implement (ex. allergic reactions).

Discuss lifespan considerations for undesired effects for medications.

Discuss client use of medication over time with over-the-counter medications and home remedies including herbal remedies.

Determine medications in which desired and undesired effects are important to monitor.

4. Describe the importance of federal regulations and resources to guide practice.
