Description Students appl

Students apply theory related to alteration in body systems through observation, assessment, and interaction with clients in laboratory and acute care settings. Nursing interventions are individualized to meet each client's needs with consideration of the client's culture. The Nursing Process is implemented with an emphasis on critical thinking. Organizational skills are developed with opportunities to care for multiple clients. Students will demonstrate effective communication with other members of the multidisciplinary health care team. Professional nursing behavior will be demonstrated.This course will also cover the characteristics of hazardous wastes and its safe handling, storage, and disposal. (Prerequisites: Successfully complete all Semester 1 Courses in order to advance to Semester 2

Identify safe practices using technology for medication administration in the acute setting. (ex. medication database for intravenous medication compatibility, automated medication delivery system)

Predict potential patient complications related to medications.

Discuss hazardous waste as it related to standard of practice for medication disposal.
