Learning Objectives

Determine client's support systems, coping skills, and resources.

Analyze a client's reaction to a diagnosis of acute or chronic mental illness and evaluate the constructive use of defense mechanisms by the client.

Describe methods to assist the client to maintain self-control of behavior.

Discuss ways to evaluate the client's response to treatment plan.

Explore therapeutic communication techniques in care of the client with mental illness.

Discuss assessments and plan for interventions to meet the client's mental health needs.

3. Examine the impact of culture on the client and family or support person(s).

Identify the emotional problems of client or client needs that are related to religious/spiritual beliefs.

Determine how culture influences the care and expectations of a client with behavioral health concerns.

Discuss ways to assess and plan for interventions that meet the client's spiritual needs.

Explore nursing interventions that promote and support the cultural practices of clients and families in multiple settings.

4. Categorize the medications used in treatment of mental illness.

Recognize common medication categories used in mental health clients.

Identify side effects and adverse effects of medications used in mental health clients.

Predict expected therapeutic effects and clinical outcomes of medications used in mental health clients.

5. Examine principles of treatment for individuals experiencing alterations in mental health and illness.

Learning Objectives

Describe the mental health/mental illness continuum.

Identify nursing interventions for the client with mental illness.

Determine the potential for violence and use safety precautions in crisis.

Recognize alterations in sensory and perceptual abilities and provide reality-based interventions.

Identify causes of stress to assist the client in stress management techniques.

6. Use professional terminology to describe disorders and behaviors of the client, family or support person(s).

Discuss plan for client experiencing abuse or neglect and possible interventions.

Determine barriers and/or stressors that impact family functioning and evaluate resources available to assist family functioning.

Appraise a client for drug and/or alcohol dependencies.

Appraise a client for withdrawal or toxicities and appropriate interventions.

8. Implement critical thinking and the nursing process to devise a comprehensive plan of care for patients with mental illness and their family or support person(s).

Discuss the nursing role and other roles within the health care team in the treatment of mental illness.

Discuss the impact of mental illness on the family system and include family in care planning.

Apply knowledge of client psychopathology to mental health concepts applied in individual/group/family therapy. Assist family to plan care for client with impaired cognition.
