Identify the cause of dependency in the social welfare issue chosen for the research assignment including individual, familial, cultural, and/or structural factors.

Explain why the chosen social issue negatively impacts society in general using facts from research.

Discuss the service delivery system that exists to address the social issue chosen.

Critique how well the service delivery system, chosen in the research assignment, meets the needs of those it is intended to serve.

Recommend any changes needed in the chosen service delivery system to better meet the needs of individuals served.

Illustrate the use of a variety of credible and scholarly sources to objectively examine the selected social welfare issue and service delivery system.
